"The space between" is a meditation on space, aloneness, connection, and comfort. It is a duet that involves deep listening between the performers. It invites the audience into a shared sense of time being drawn out and snapped back, and a shared sense of breath being held and exhaled.

"Powerball" (Draft #1), in development in collaboration with the dancers, is a dive into characters: a narrator named Eddie from 1946, the lineage of women entertainers like the flapper girls of old and the Vanna White's of television, plus "the village" – a small town archetype of high-stakes ritual and tradition. Connected through plot points derived from "The Lottery" by Shirley Jackson, these characters tell the story of America past and present. A commentary on pop culture, politics, and social injustice, this mashup work is a compilation of references that insist we take stock of current events, the long term implications of these, and address the past, present and future through a dystopic lens.
