SOUNDBODY is the culmination of my 10week research exploring cymatics—the study of making sound waves visible—within the body. Over time, this curiosity of how sound moves me evolved into the development of movement scores that recognize the body first as matter, second as a collection of moving particles and finally, as an expression of energy experiencing itself through sensation through a dance of space, sound, and time. At its core, this work is a study in experiential boundlessness and learning to expand the body and consciousness beyond the physical scope to recognize oneself as non-separate from the whole energetic ecosystem that we as alive beings move, breathe, and dream within.


A personal reflection of self-concept through experiencing hardships with others and hardships on our own and the growth that came from it.







(R)evolution Artist Program 2026

Want to be a part of DISCO RIOT's (R)evolution Artist Program in 2026? We believe the next phase of building a truly sustainable dance ecosystem in San Diego hinges on the integration of young artist voices. This program is a cohort-style paid internship focused on experiential learning for San Diego-based rising dance artists. We will provide a small group of Rising Artists (ages 20-26) a curated immersive experience in DISCO RIOT's inner workings for a full programming season (January 1 - October 31, 2026). The program includes free dance classes, monthly professional development workshops and cohort meetings, a monthly check-in with a uniquely designated mentor, and a collaborative 10-week SPACE residency with an opportunity to showcase original work as the culminating project of the program. Additional personalized assignments

include performance and event production, administration support, an apprenticeship with Malashock Dance Company, and teaching opportunities.
